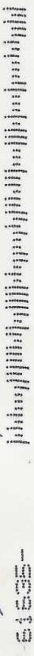

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

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Yousuf Karsh

Yousuf Karsh (1908 – 2002) is the most renowned portrait photographer of our time. He has perceptively photographed the statesmen, artists, and literary and scientific figures that have shaped our lives in the 20th century. Known for his ability to transform “the human face into legend,” many of the portraits that he created have become virtually the image of the great man or woman they portray, whether Winston Churchill, Ernest Hemingway, Albert Einstein, Georgia O’Keeffe or Helen Keller. In other words, “to experience a Karsh photograph is to feel in the presence of history itself.” His work is represented in the collections of the Metropolitan Museum of Art and the Museum of Modern Art in New York, the Philadelphia Art Museum, the Art Institute of Chicago, the National Gallery of Canada, the National Portrait Gallery in London, the National Gallery of Japan, the National Gallery of Australia, and other leading museums. In 1996, he presented a major collection to the Museum of Fine Arts in Boston. He has received the Canada Council Medal and is a Companion of the Order of Canada, his adopted country’s highest civilian honor, as well as been the recipient of more than two dozen honorary degrees.
